We turned over the Ft. Bragg Hospitality House ministry in late June to Jeremy and Kim Cover, to assume full-time leadership of the Cadence Eastern Field. Transitioning to this role has provided a strange mix of both joy and grief for us.





We now have the opportunity to spend more time with Cadence staff and be involved in their lives in deeper ways. Praying, mentoring, and caring for their lives and ministries has filled us with purpose and fulfillment. We do this very practically by visiting them and also spending time with them monthly over phone/text/email/video chat to provide encouragement, support, and challenge. 
## **FAMILY UPDATE**
