It seems like people are always surprised to hear that we keep up with the guys we work with and continue ministry with them after they leave Okinawa. We'd like to share with you what that looks like. Mitchell left us in July, relocating to Luke AFB in Arizona. Landon left us over a year ago to be a missionary ESL teacher in Cambodia. Here at the Hansen Christian Center (HCC), we encourage those who attend to develop close relationships with fellow believers. These two guys have remained friends. When Landon needed to return stateside for VISA requirements, he moved in with Mitchell. Here's what they have to say about their time in Okinawa and the present.

Landon

"Oh, you're not a people-person? You're following Jesus, though, right? So, guess what? You are now a people-person!" I recall overhearing this comment from Darrow a handful of times over the course of my three-year tour in Okinawa. Even as a solid Myers-Briggs type INTJ (Introverted, iNtuitive, Thinking, Judging) at the time, I always liked hearing that comment. It was indicative of the transformation inherent with followership—not that our personalities are altered into some kind of prosaic, one-size-fits-all rubber stamp. Rather, we become who we truly are in Christ and that ALWAYS entails loving and developing deep relationships with others, no matter what your Myers-Briggs type is.

Vicki and Darrow came alongside to share the love of Christ and mentor me in how to navigate these issues in my life.


MINISTRY DURING COVID-19

Despite COVID-19, ministry has never stopped at HCC, and it's possibly become even busier due to more one-on-one ministry. How and where we do ministry has changed, as we follow guidelines from both the Camp Hansen Chapel and the Japanese government. It was a bit interesting at the beginning of all this because restrictions vary by base and branch of service. It's even more interesting on a Marine base because the base is run by the Marines, but the chapel is run by the Navy and they may have different restrictions. We thought all these changes would really impact our numbers and reach. However, we have been pleasantly surprised by our continued ability to reach out and connect with the military personnel here.
















Some of the changes our ministry has gone through have included meeting outside on bleachers, live-streamed Sunday services, and Bible studies via Zoom, on the beach, or occasionally at HCC or the Chapel, just to name a few. It has even affected whether we've been allowed to sing or provide food/ communion! We're able to serve food again with safety precautions in place, and do socially-distanced outings as well now!

Darrow has also been very instrumental at the chapel during the lockdowns doing the livestreams and directing all the moving parts. He is especially pivotal since we have a different chaplain giving the message each week. At HCC, Darrow has enjoyed teaching through the commands of Jesus, Seeing and Savoring Jesus Christ (John Piper), and has also introduced Bible drills.

FAMILY NEWS

Vicki left Okinawa on June 10 to take James back to the U.S. to get his driver's license and to prepare for college. The plan was for Vicki to return after taking the kids to college, but for a period of time Japan did not allow VISA holders to return, and then her VISA expired. Japan has finally lifted their restrictions slightly, so Vicki will be able to return when she gets a new visa. Since the return date will be so close to the holidays, she may just stay, with the possibility that I (Darrow) will join her and then return to Okinawa together.

PRAYER REQUESTS


- Please pray for Vicki's safe return to Okinawa.
