She dearly misses Thailand and is doing a virtual school, which is not a great way to meet friends. We recently started going to church and she is getting to know some people. Pray the Lord will meet her and gently lead her.

We thank God that Jim is doing so much better. He absolutely loves to dream and envision all that could happen here at Victory Ranch. We also thank God that our son Jayce's health is improving after recently being diagnosed with Crohn's Disease. We pray that he will continue to have good health and will find a great community. Pray for our oldest son Jake, as he is in the US Air Force and is deployed. I pray for godly connections and people that will come alongside him. All that I love about Cadence and their investment into U.S. Military people, I pray for Jake to find! What Cadence does has become so much more real to me now that he is in the military.
