### Unhindered. It's the last word Luke wrote in the book of Acts: Akolutos.

We chose this word as the theme of our 2020 Cadence world-wide staff conference, a gathering that takes place every five years. Except . . . it didn't take place. We didn't gather in 2020, and we won't be gathering in 2021.

In 2020, Cadence ministries adapted to local, military, and country restrictions—meeting by Zoom, in small groups in homes, in Facebook Bible studies, and by other creative means. Like most others around the globe, we were hindered from carrying out business as usual.

But here's the great news: the gospel was never—never—hindered. When Luke wrote the conclusion of his chronicles of the early church, Paul had been ministering from house arrest in Rome for the past two years. Restrictions, limitations, and challenges were part of his life. Still, the Kingdom of God marched on.

This memorable year, 2020, has been a year of personal and corporate grief, of world-wide suffering, of tension, crisis, and deep pain. And in the midst of these months, we have had the opportunity to listen, to lament, to learn, and to live in dependence on Almighty God who is worthy of our worship and service no matter what the circumstances.

Military people, in some ways, live like this every year—with danger, in unfamiliar surroundings, with sacrifice, and keeping the bigger picture—their mission—in mind.

May we not leave the lessons and hardships of 2020 too quickly, but rather be strengthened and mobilized to "welcome . . . proclaim the kingdom of God . . . and teach . . . the Lord Jesus Christ with all openness, **unhindered**," no matter what the next year holds.

### Ministries

Cadence International is an evangelical mission agency dedicated to reaching the military communities of the United States and of the world with the good news of Jesus Christ. Founded in 1954, Cadence's mission is to **share the gospel and our lives with the military community**. More than 200 Cadence staff serve all branches of the U.S. military at more than 50 locations worldwide, supporting military personnel and their families.

**Adult Ministry** impacts military people through hospitality houses, authentic community, home-cooked meals, coffee house ministry, retreats, small group Bible studies, life-on-life discipleship, and involvement in military chapels.

**Student and Children's Ministry** reaches military kids by partnering with chapel youth groups, leading VBS and weekly Bible studies, adventures and retreats, mentoring, and local and global outreach.

**Foreign Armed Forces Ministry** influences security forces and military communities of other nations through professional development, biblical discipleship, and social relief programs.

**LifeCompass** offers a five-month discipleship intensive course for adults ages 18–30 in South Carolina, with ten weeks of lecture and four weeks of cross-cultural outreach.

**Alumni** engages those who have been involved in a Cadence or OCSC ministry—whether attending, volunteering, or leading.

**Headquarters and Pastoral Care Team** provides leadership and support to the mission and the missionaries of Cadence through the HQ departments of Leadership, Human Resources, Finance, Mobilization, Operations, and Communications. The Pastoral Care Team ministers through coaching, soul care, and training.

I don't know how to describe our first visit to The Hangar other than to say that it felt like home. We enjoyed a home cooked meal, fellowship with other believers, a devotion, and during all of that our kids were being cared for and taught The Word as well. After sitting through that first Hangar night, for the first time since arriving in Germany, I felt like I might just be okay and make it through this assignment. But I could never have imagined the wonderful things God had in store for us through this ministry.


