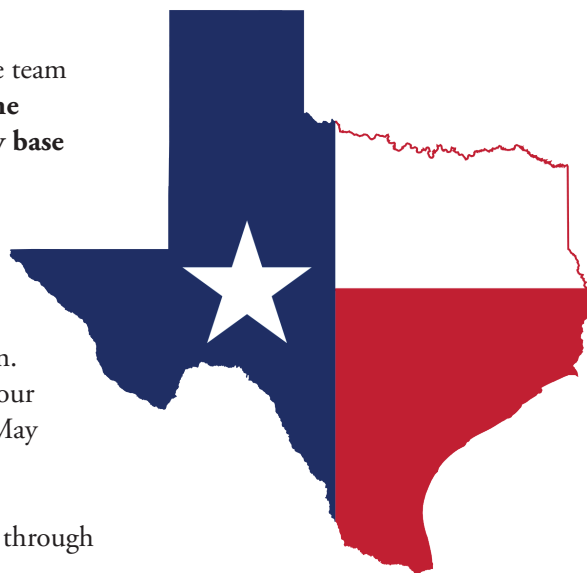

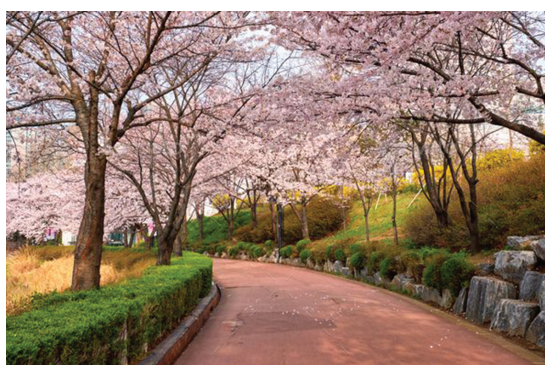

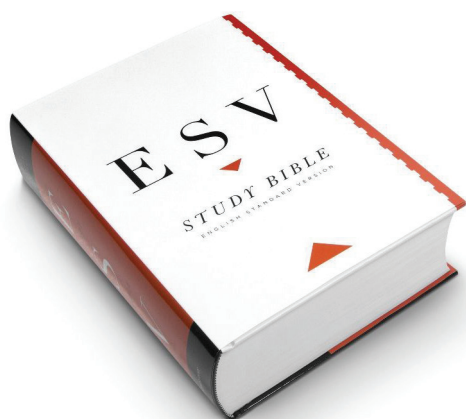


OUR LAST CHRISTMAS IN KOREA
