hilippians 2:14–15 says, "Do everything without complaining or arguing, so that you may become blameless and pure, children of God without fault in a crooked and depraved generation, in which you **shine like stars in the universe**."

I am struck in this passage by the beautiful calling we have to be witnesses as shining stars and ambassadors of Jesus to this broken and sinful world. These verses are some of the lifegiving applications to the amazing section just prior on the incarnation of Christ and our call to live as servants.

I am again challenged by Paul's choice of imperatives in this text—"Do everything [all things] without complaining [grumbling/murmuring] or arguing [foolish disputing] SO THAT . . ." The emphasis is obviously mine. Our witness of the incarnate Christ to the world is dependent on our attitudes and conversations as God's chosen people. We cannot be chronic grumblers against Him and others, nor habitual arguers over foolish matters, and still carry forth the Word of life and shine as stars. Wow!

As I reflect on this past year, I can think of no more appropriate verses in Scripture to help calibrate our hearts as believers in the days in which we are now living. It's been my calling to all our staff throughout Cadence that our lives and conversations must be marked by love, respect, and gratitude—that our attitudes would stand out as shining stars for the gospel.

It's been a fruitful year in ministry to the military. God is at work! It's also been a year of aligning our hearts to a continued spirit of gratefulness for the grace of the gospel.

Friends, life in this broken and sinful world will provide a constant stream of difficulties to either chronically complain about or foolishly dispute and argue over. On the contrary, because of what Christ has done for us in His incarnation, death, and resurrection, we have the Spirit-powered opportunity to stand out as different in these challenging days. We can "be glad and rejoice" with Paul (verse 18), with each other, and in the joy of the profound grace we have experienced and are experiencing.

We can all indeed continue to "shine like stars in the universe!"

Cadence International is an evangelical mission agency dedicated to reaching the military communities of the United States and of the world with the good news of Jesus Christ. Founded in 1954, Cadence's mission is to **share the gospel and our lives with the military community**. More than 200 Cadence staff serve all branches of the U.S. military at more than 50 locations worldwide, supporting military personnel and their families.

Adult Ministry impacts military people through hospitality houses, home-cooked meals, authentic community, coffee house ministry, retreats, small group Bible studies, life-on-life discipleship, and involvement in military chapels.

Student and Children's Ministry reaches military kids by partnering with chapel youth groups, leading VBS and weekly Bible studies, adventures and retreats, mentoring, and local and global outreach.

Foreign Military Ministry influences security forces and military communities of other nations through professional development, biblical discipleship, and social relief programs.

Alumni engages those who have been involved in a Cadence or OCSC ministry—whether attending, volunteering, or leading.

Headquarters provides leadership and support to the mission and the missionaries of Cadence through the HQ departments of Leadership, Human Resources, Finance, and Communications.

Pastoral Care Team offers coaching, soul care, and training to Cadence staff.
