CADENCE HIGHLIGHTS

Last summer, almost the entire Cadence family gathered for our worldwide conference held every five years at Green Lake, Wisconsin. A group of 364 adults and children assembled, eagerly ready to meet with God and fellowship together. A two-year delay due to the pandemic increased our love for each other and our gratitude for the privilege of gathering.

Our theme was "Unhindered." This Greek word, *akolutos*, is the very last one Luke wrote in the book of Acts. It's a powerful conclusion to the glorious account of the coming



of the Holy Spirit, the church's establishment and growth, and the gospel's expansion.

Unhindered! Akolutos! We long for this to be an increasing reality in our lives and in Cadence.

How delightful it must have been for Luke to pen that word after witnessing and experiencing all the challenges, hardships, persecutions, and opposition that the early church and its leaders faced as they shared the gospel and their lives in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the ends of the earth.

Yet despite this opposition, the gospel gets the last word! We celebrated this unstoppable gospel through God's unhindered church. As one of the plenary speakers, I focused on the four verbs in the last two verses of Acts which described Paul's ministry in Rome from his place of house arrest: he **stayed**, he **welcomed**, he **taught**

about Jesus, and he **proclaimed** the kingdom of God. It was wonderful to have Joyce's brother, Dr. Steve Patty of Dialogues in Action, and Dr. Juli Slattery of Authentic Intimacy, join me as plenary speakers.

Another exciting highlight this past year is the continued pioneering and growth of the **Cadence Alumni Ministry**. A long-time dream of Joyce's father, Dick Patty, God is blessing this ministry through the leadership and pastoring of Angie and Duncan Sprague. An alumnus is anyone who has participated, served, or volunteered in an OCSC/Cadence ministry. Joyce often says about these dear people: "We loved you then, we love you now, and we will always love you."



Angie and Duncan spent a year on an **Alumni RV Tour** gathering and meeting with alumni across the United States. Joyce and I participated in some of these gatherings, and the testimonies we heard from our alumni were powerful and so encouraging.
