- Our Cadence Alumni ministry is growing and expanding. Alumni are those who have
 participated or served in an OCSC/Cadence ministry at some time in their lives. This
 ministry seeks to connect, encourage, and mobilize Cadence alumni for Christ and military

Every year leaders from several military ministries come together to connect, collaborate, and communicate over how we can support each other in this fruitful and vital calling of military ministry. The spirit of love and unity among these ministries is a beautiful picture of the body of Christ at work!
- Speaking of birthday parties, this past August eighty people gathered at the Travis
 Hospitality House in Fairfield, California to celebrate fifty years of ministry in that same
 location. What an amazing time of hearing stories of how God transformed lives in that
 ministry. A former Cadence board member and long-time military spouse pointed across
 the living room and enthusiastically proclaimed, "I trusted Christ right there in 1975!"

These are glimpses of the highlights of God's work in and through Cadence this past year. I write with a great sense of anticipation for how the Lord will continue to bear eternal fruit for His Kingdom in the days ahead.

Ministries

Cadence International is an evangelical mission agency dedicated to reaching the military communities of the United States and of the world with the good news of Jesus Christ. Founded in 1954, Cadence's mission is to **share the gospel and our lives with the military community**. More than 200 Cadence staff serve all branches of the U.S. military at more than 50 locations worldwide, supporting military personnel and their families.

Adult Ministry impacts military people through hospitality houses, home-cooked meals, authentic community, coffee house ministry, retreats, small group Bible studies, life-on-life discipleship, and involvement in military chapels.

Student and Children's Ministry

reaches military kids by partnering with chapel youth groups, leading VBS and weekly Bible studies, adventures and retreats, mentoring, and local and global outreach.

Foreign Military Ministry

influences security forces and military communities of other nations through professional development, biblical discipleship, and social relief programs.



Alumni engages those who have been involved in a Cadence or OCSC ministry—whether attending, volunteering, or leading.

Headquarters provides leadership and support to the mission and the missionaries of Cadence through the HQ departments of Leadership, Human Resources, Finance, and Communications.

Pastoral Care Team offers coaching, soul care, and training to Cadence staff.

The highlight this past year was putting on a "Night in Bethlehem" event where over 150 people were able to interact with ministry volunteers painting, hammering, and rolling dough. Kids and parents sat down together at the stable to hear the Good News.
