Spring has returned, and we are excited and privileged to have two Airman, Jeff and Josh, doing an internship at the Hangar with a program called SkillBridge. This program is available to men and women in the military who are preparing to separate or retire. It connects service members with industry or military partners for real-world training. Both men are coming alongside us in ministry for six months before the end of their military commitment. They and their families had been part of the ministry at the Hangar throughout their tenure in Germany. We are preparing them to move *from the military to ministry* once they return home.



Please pray as we continue to lead with help from new volunteers at The Hangar. We are excited to offer new discipleship training on Monday nights for our singles and young married couples and are continuing a study in the book of Matthew during our Thursday night fellowship. We're also hosting men's and

women's monthly nights of fellowship and fun. Our morning Porch and Play program for parents and kids continues on Wednesdays. Joe gathers with men at the chapel for Bible study on Tuesday mornings, and Jill meets with women at the chapel on Tuesday nights. Our lives are full, but God is good, giving us wisdom, strength, and guidance, and we are enjoying the journey of faith. Behold! God is doing a new thing with good volunteer leaders and great fellowship and is consistently growing our faith and trust in God!

As new people continue to come while others depart as they are transferred to new locations, there is always a mixture of tears and gladness. It is a joy to serve the Lord here at Spangdahlem Air Base in this Cadence ministry, and we're so thankful for the love, prayers, words of encouragement, financial support, and friendships around the world that are helping this ministry.
