WAYS WE SERVE

Cadence is a Christian mission agency dedicated to reaching the military communities of the United States and of the world with the good news of Jesus Christ. Our mission is to share the gospel and our lives with the military community.

Adult Ministry impacts service members and their families through hospitality houses, authentic community, shared meals, coffee house ministries, retreats, small group Bible studies, life-on-life discipleship, and participation in military chapels or local churches.

Student and Children's Ministry reach military kids by partnering with chapel youth groups, leading VBS and weekly Bible studies, organizing adventures and retreats, providing mentoring, and conducting outreach activities.

Foreign Military Ministry serves security forces and military communities abroad through relationship-building, professional development, biblical discipleship, and social relief programs.

Alumni Ministry engages those who have previously participated in a Cadence or OCSC ministry—whether attending, volunteering, or leading.

Headquarters Staff provide leadership and support to Cadence missionaries through departments including Leadership, Human Resources, Finance, IT, Mobilization, and Communications.

Cadence Care Team offers counseling, spiritual care, and training for Cadence staff, as well as specialized ministry for Cadence Kids.

Disciples Being Formed

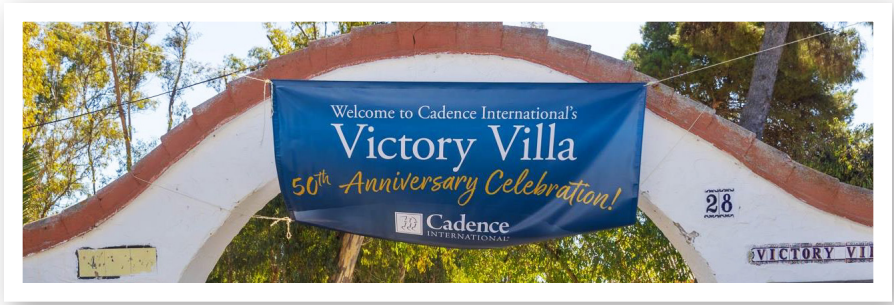

Active-Duty Service Members Empowered

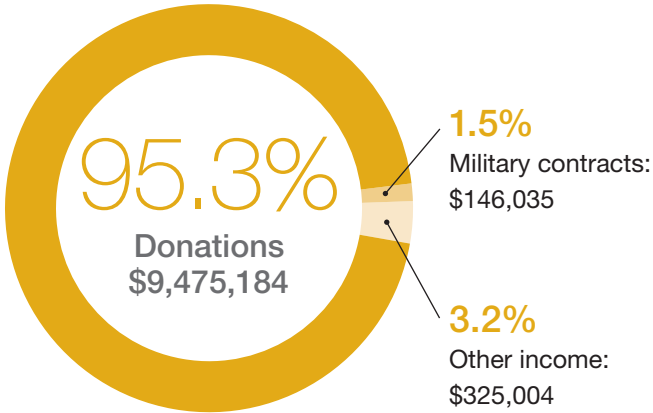

Ministering to Frontline Soldiers in Ukraine

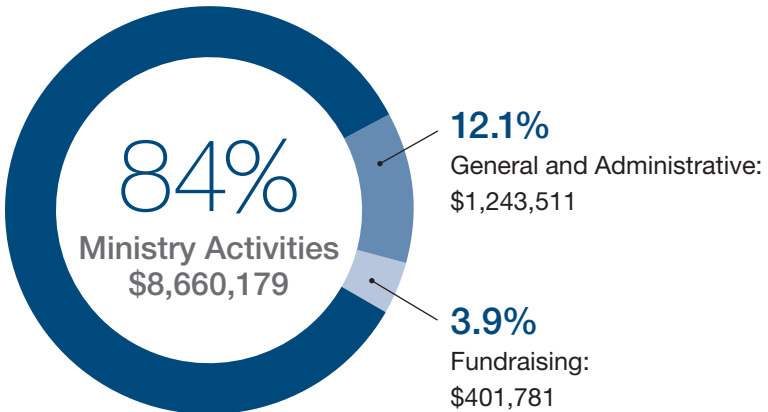

Net assets as of May 31, 2025 stood at **\$12,315,950.**

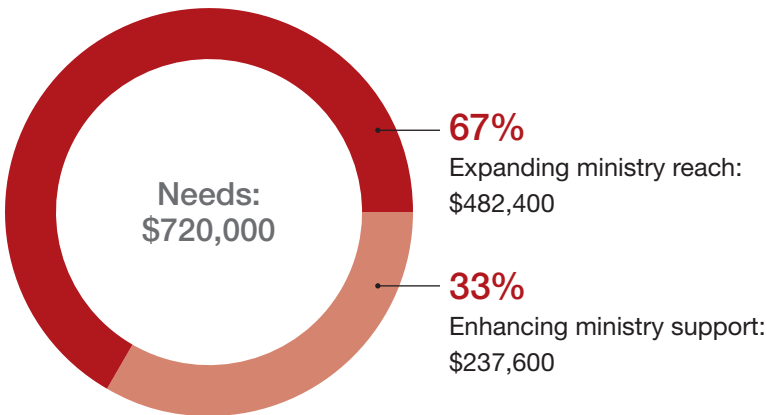

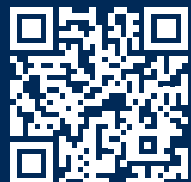
